Dear Art, English Language Arts, Social Studies and other interested teachers:

Heritage NL is pleased to launch our 14th annual Heritage Places Poster Contest – a K to 12 contest aimed at fostering student awareness of our province’s heritage and culture.

Heritage places, their uses and the stories about them remind us of who we are and they have a place in our future. Through art and writing, we want students to tell us what these places mean to them. Students are asked to create a poster themed after an existing heritage place in their own community or region and prepare a short written statement. Posters can depict the building or place, as well as stories and uses associated with it.

Please see the contest guidelines document for a detailed explanation of the contest.

Following last year’s contest we asked teachers for feedback. In response to your replies we have made some changes to this year’s program. In addition to regular grade level and school prizes, 6 new regional prizes and 1 new digital art prize have been added. 1 prize will be awarded in each of the following regions: St. John’s, Avalon, Eastern, Central, Western and Labrador. The digital art prize encourages students with an interest and skill in digital art and graphics to participate.

The Heritage Places Poster Contest meets a variety of Curriculum Outcomes as prescribed by the Department of Education (please see attachment). By completing this project, students from Kindergarten to Level Three can meet educational goals in Art, English Language Arts and Social Studies.
